 Good Shepherd Sunday**

Symbol & Image of the Shepherd

Our Lord's teaching that he is one who cares for his people like a good shepherd remains a strong image. This is reflected in the Latin word for a shepherd, *pastor*. Bishop's in the Anglican & Catholic tradition carry a pastoral staff – a shepherd's crook - to indicate his care of the Diocese. This Gospel image comes from ancient agricultural society. In our nation we have vast fenced paddocks & the name shepherd is rarely used. However, the Gospel image still speaks to us of Christ's relationship with all those who believe in him. This is especially reflected in the resurrection story of Mary Magdalene standing at the empty tomb on the first Easter Day. She does not recognise Jesus and mistakes him to be the gardener. When Jesus calls her name she fulfils today's reading, *"My sheep hear my voice; know them, and they follow me - and instantly she recognises him.*

Many parishes have just one setting of the Eucharist, which they sing Sunday after Sunday, year in and year out, with no variation. On Thursday afternoon at the regular meeting of the Archbishop, Bishops and Archdeacons our new 'trade' name and logo was presented. It was welcomed by all and thought to be very good.

The next stage is that it will go before one of the five administrative departments of the Diocese: the PMC (*Parish & other Mission Agencies Commission*). Once their approval has been given it will then go the Diocesan Council. Our new archdeacon, Ken Suddick, who is Rector of Mt Gravatt, has said he will guide our application through these stages.
