*Jesus tells of his gift  
of the Paraclete – the Holy Spirit*

**Welcome to the Mass Today**

At this point of Eastertide we hear of our Lord's teaching about his gift of the

Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, to the Church. Christ is specific on this point – it is a gift to the Church; his disciples, his body - not to the world.

This does not mean that the Holy Spirit is not active in the world, quite to the contrary. What it does mean is that this is a direct unique and personal gift to the Church, to make present always the presence of the Risen Christ. It is the Holy Spirit that accomplishes the saving words and actions of Christ in our midst. This is especially true at the Eucharist.

More. The Spirit is the living tradition of the Church guiding it always through the tangle of history and human hearts to discern the truth, so that the Gospel is proclaimed to all people, in all times and in all places – and that is what the word Catholic means.

### **Some News about Worship**

**1. Mass Shalom.** In four weeks time we will begin to learn a new musical setting of the mass called 'Mass Shalom'. This will become the fourth musical setting of the Eucharist that we will know. To help us learn this setting we will have some practice at it before the mass.

#### **2. 'From Age to Age: How Christians celebrate the Eucharist'.**

This is booklet being prepared by Fr Martyn. It will be like our Sunday worship book, which we use each week. On the left hand page will be the order of service. The right hand page, however, will provide a commentary giving explanations about each part of the liturgy. It will comment on history, the meaning of each part as well as explaining traditional words used by the Church. The booklet is intended to help parishioners understand the mass, to pray it and to enter more deeply into this form of worship used from age to age in the Christian centuries.

### **Bones of Herod the Great?**

The Hebrew University in Jerusalem says it has located the missing tomb of King Herod the Great. Herod was a pivotal figure in the religious and political history of the Holy Land. This discovery, if accurate, has more going for it than the recently publicised tomb of Jesus, which was ignored by archaeologists and historians as utter foolishness.

If confirmed, the tomb's discovery at Herod's palace complex, the Herodium, 12 kilometres south-east of Jerusalem, in the occupied West Bank, could be one of the most significant finds in Middle Eastern archaeology in many years.
