Times of Services

Thank you to all of those who responded to the survey about new service times. The Parish Council found it helpful in shaping the decision and spent *an hour and twenty minutes discussing the issue!*

Why so long? The Council is not tinkering with times for nothing - it is looking to the future and the growth of the parish and to do this has set two objectives:

1. Increase the contact time for Fr Martyn with the growing congregation at Camp Hill.
2. To introduce a totally new alternative form of service by September for those who have had no or little contact with the Anglican Church.

The first of these is relatively easy to deal with – the second will need time for research, structuring & advertising.

Interim Arrangements

To help deal with the first of the objectives the Sunday services will be:

Camp Hill 8am, Norman Park 10.30am.

The new Norman Park time is based on their response to the survey and comments made last Sunday.

But Later

Between now and September we will continue to discuss this issue for our future and seek satisfactory service times. This will be shaped by when we have the new form of service – either a Saturday night or on a Sunday mid-morning.

A New Name!

After months of discussing this issue and with the advice of consultants the Parish Council has agreed with **Eastern Hills Anglicans.**

The next stage will be in devising a logo to go with the name, again the consulting firm will help us – at no cost to the parish.

The stage after that is the agreement of our neighbouring parishes and the consent of the Diocesan Council. Our new archdeacon Fr Ken Suddick is encouraging us and supportive in this process.

The Parish announces the launch of the 2007/2008 Entertainment Book, valid from April 2007 to 1 June 2008.
