Growing in cooperation with neighbouring parishes:
What about a Mission District?

One way we could cooperate with our neighbouring parishes and schools is to come together as a Mission District. We still retain our parish identity, but we become more fluid in sharing resources. Long-term planning for the future could be done for a whole district. It could enable parishes to look at buildings and sites in relationship to other centres. A good example is Bulimba (after their commercial development) and Morningside parishes do not have a hall. Cannon Hill, Murrarie and Tingalpa do not have a parish church – but there is CHAC, which has a natural connection with the area. these are all fertile areas for the future.
