New Service: The Future of Norman Park?

Even though, for the immediate future, there are no Sunday Services at Norman Park this does not mean it will be closed down – it will remain a vital resource centre for the Parish and the Deanery.

The Continued use of NP

- Norman Park will still be a place where **Baptisms, Weddings** and **Funerals** will still take place.
- Norman Park will still have **Christmas, Easter, Patronal Festival**, and **All Souls Day** services
- A **new** 9.30am Tuesday Eucharist will be celebrated.
- The **Julian Meetings** will continue on Tuesday evenings.
- **Special Events:** Parish Fairs, Passover Celebration, River Fire Festival, CHANT and other special events will continue.

Last of all the Norman Park congregation is a **valued and integral part** of Eastern Hills Anglicans. Those on the rosters will automatically be on the rosters for the new services - if they wish to.



New Service: Outreach & Mission – Getting it right

One of the greatest difficulties for the *Consultative Group on Worship* is imagining a new form of worship that will help to newcomers. All of us have been shaped by a very strong tradition and identity through worship. So what we may think will help newcomers is not always accurate. This happens because we slip so easily into what we like and feel comfortable in. We have to keep on reminding us **that the new service is for newcomers**. To make the task even more difficult we have also tried to shape the new service on the Eucharist – for we are a Eucharistic Church. There is no integrity if we abandon the Eucharist. So the task is draw new people into this central and core tradition of Eucharistic worship established by our Master Christ. Hopefully, our regular worshippers will find familiar landmarks and symbols of the Mass, but in a new format, which will enrich and even open eyes to this gift of Christ for all people.



New Service: Becoming Missionaries

Most of us have an admiration for the Mormons who are prepared to give two years to become missionaries. These missionaries are supported by their sect at home because of the **sacrifice** these young men and women willingly give. This may be a helpful image for us.

The new service is a **missionary undertaking** – but you are not being asked to go door knocking in another country. But you are being asked to be **generous and supportive** of the time changes and the new service at 8am. The reality is that a small adjustment is being asked of you as a member of a community, - participating in a community venture, - to fulfill in a small way the task of reaching out and going beyond – and of responding to our Lord's command to draw all people into the Kingdom.
