Welcome.

Today's gospel reading is the famous story about our Lord changing water into wine which, could be a festival day for CHANT, the Parish wine club. Despite many funny stories, associations and jokes about this miracle there is a profound truth in the event which touches us all. This is because our faith is about transformation and transfiguration; that the water of our daily life is to be changed into the wine of the kingdom.

The second aspect of the story is about the One who can accomplish this transformation - it is Christ, not ourselves. Of course this is parallel to the Eucharist; we bring the bread and the wine and the Holy Spirit accomplishes again and makes present the words and actions of Christ. But nothing can happen if we do not bring ourselves and our bread and wine to Him.

Epiphanytide & Ordinary Time

A new season of the Church year is upon us.

Last Sunday brought an end to stories of Jesus' birth, baptism and early life in the Festivals of Christmastide. Now it is time to hear about his work as a full adult, as the man who was also God's Word. That is the content of two seasons; *Epiphanytide* that runs to the end of January, and *Ordinary Time* (also known as Sundays after Trinity or Pentecost) runs after the Lent /Easter season, for a total of around 30 Sundays.

There are three years worth of readings for these Sundays, called Years A, B, and C. In each of these years one particular Gospel writer is featured. This is year C, and we will hear the Gospel according to Luke. Before the reading of it each Sunday the following words will be proclaimed: "A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke."

Before we begin with Luke, however, the Church is giving us a brief transition this Sunday from John's gospel. It is a story of the adult Christ on the cusp of his public ministry. It is a sort of preparation for hearing the story of Jesus' life (according to Luke).
