***Saint of the Week 4 August:  
Mary Sumner, Founder of the Mothers' Union***

Mary Elizabeth Sumner (née Heywood) was born in 1828. In 1848, she married a young curate, George Sumner, nephew of Archbishop Sumner, who was himself to become Bishop of Guildford in 1888. A mother of three children, Mary called a meeting in 1876 at which the Mothers' Union was founded, providing a forum in which to unite mothers of all classes in the aim of bringing up children in the Christian faith. Baptism and parental example were its two basic principles. At first a parish organisation, it grew steadily into an international concern, encouraging the ideal of a Christian home. Mary died on this day in 1921. Though the Mothers Union in this country is no longer a big organisation, it flourishes in the Third World. It provides an organisation for woman in places where they have no voice and status.

***Readings for Next Sunday, 14 August  
Festival of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Assumption)***

**Revelation 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10**

Some passages of the Book of Revelation are not easy to decipher and this reading is no exception. The underlying theme of the whole book is addressing the persecution of the Church by the Emperor Diocletian at the end of the first century. John the Elder who wrote the book is encouraging the early Christians not to fear, because the outcome has already been defeated. Christ has already conquered sin, evil and death and, the warfare in the heavens has also been decided by Christ.

**1 Corinthians 15:20-27**

Paul rejoices that Christ is the new human being upon whom a new human race is constituted – the Church. Through his death and resurrection death itself has been defeated – a victory to be shared by all. The festival of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates that fact.

**Luke 1:39-56.**

Most feast days for the Blessed Virgin Mary have this particular Gospel. It is Mary's canticle of praise. She gives thanks for God's mercy in keeping his promises and even though she has been chosen to be the Mother of the Lord she rejoices first in being God's servant.
